The Alzheimer's Society Walk and Talk Group

The Alzheimer's Society Walk and Talk group in Worthington Park offers an opportunity for people with dementia and their carers and families to enjoy the outdoors, increase physical fitness and maintain independence.

The group also provides a confidential environment where people can share experiences or simply chat with others in a similar situation. Trained staff and volunteers are on hand to help people get the most out of the sessions and provide information and advice.

We meet every Tuesday at 10-30 am at the Broad Road entrance and walk for about 40 minutes before enjoying refreshments at High Lee House. We have twenty regular walkers in our very friendly and welcoming group and people have told us that "it helps keep my Mother mobile and gives her company, " the walk is "good company with exercise (but not too much exercise!)", and "it benefits me by getting out and meeting others like me"

Occasionally we may have a guest join us on the walk for an activity such as looking at the Heritage Trees or completing a quiz on features in the park like the Lions or the founder's plaque.

We often talk to other park users, many with dogs and prams as we walk along the paths. Some of the members socialise outside the group and attend other activities together such as a singing group. We try to walk whatever the weather, and would only cancel if conditions were very bad such as ice or snow.

Mostly we enjoy the company, the exercise, the beautiful and peaceful surroundings, with a welcome sit down for tea and biscuits at the end.
